Reports by Pat DeRuyter

Stage 1, February 9, 2007 Henrik Court Trailhead

Fifteen teams participated in the first day of the ASPA sponsored Race Across the Valley on Friday at Henrik Court. The ADMA maintained trails were freshly groomed (thank you, Ray) and FAST.

Mike Malvick with Corky, Mesa and Ingrid came in first in the 7.8 mile class with a time of 30:00. Not only did Mike better the record from last year by 3 minutes and 14 seconds but he showed good versatility as he skied the last 4 miles with one ski pole after breaking a pole at the intersections behind Creamer's Field.

Andy Seitz with Ed and Marshall were second at 31:03, also breaking the record from last year.

Thirteen teams competed in the 4.5 mile class. Ten of those teams beat last year's winning time. Cindy Salmon with Sock-eye and Coho with a time of 15:36 beat last years winning time by 2 minutes and 54 seconds, to carry a 20 second lead going into Day Two. Andy Warwick with Zip and Boots were second at 15:56. Carol Kleckner with Robin and Jazz were third at 16:05. Emily Bernhardt with Tex and Wiggy are 4th at 16:53. Sara Elzey with Ayla and Crowe rounded out the top 5 at 17:08.

**Stage 2, February 10, 2007
Two Rivers Nordic Ski Trails**

Last night's snow and two groomings by Tim Mowry and the Two Rivers Nordic Ski Club provided for great trail conditions for the second day of the ASPA sponsored Race Across the Valley. The trail had been damaged by lose horses and the grooming saved the race for ASPA. Thank you Tim.

In the 12.5 K race, Andy Seitz with Ed and Yeller won this stage with a time of 31:57. He broke the 2005 record for that distance by 19 seconds. Mike Malvick with Corky, Ingrid and Mesa were second at 33:09. After two days of racing, Andy (63:00) lead Mike (63:09) by nine seconds going into the final stage at North Star Golf Club on Sunday.

In the 7.5 K race, Cindy Salmon with Chinook and Sockeye pulled away from the field with a blistering time of 17:49. Cindy shattered the 2001 record for that distance by 8 minutes 20 seconds. Emily Bernhardt with Wiggy and Clyde came in second at 19:31. Peggy Raybeck with Carmen and Bronte finished third just 21 seconds back at 19:52. Carol Kleckner with Robin and Chanel were fourth at 20:30 and Sara Elzey with Ayla and Chert rounding out the top five with 20:58.

Andy Warwick had a time consuming fall on the hill past the road crossing. He broke a ski pole and lost his dog, Licorice. Fortunately the dog ran with Peggy Raybeck and Sara Elzey to the road crossing where Tom McGrane (acting as the road crossing official) caught the dog for Andy. Andy stopped and re-hooked up Licorice and skied the final 3K with one pole. This has been a tough year for ski poles as Mike Malvick broke one yesterday at Henrik Court.

After Two days of racing Cindy Salmon lead the Short Class with a time of 33:25, almost 3 minutes in front of second place. Emily Bernhardt moved from fourth to second with a time of 36:24. Carol Kleckner remained in third only 11 seconds back with a time of 36:35. Peggy Raybeck was in fourth with a time of 37:49. Sara Elzey rounded out the top five with a time of 38:06.

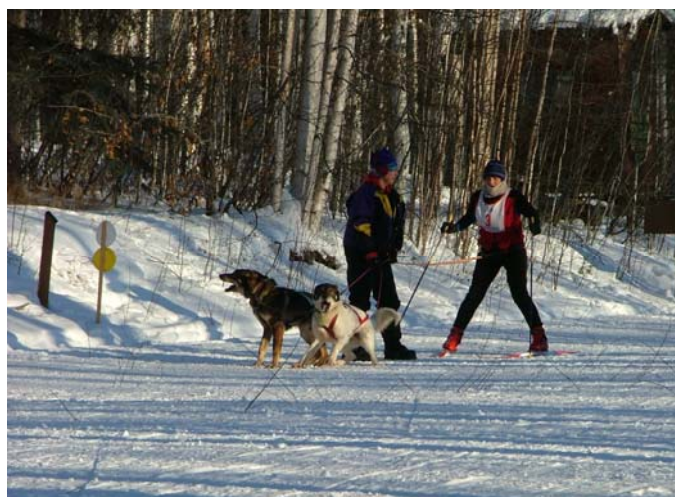
**Stage 3, February 11, 2007

A beautiful day and wonderful trails led to a record setting day at the North Star Golf Club trails for Day 3 of the ASPA Race Across the Valley.

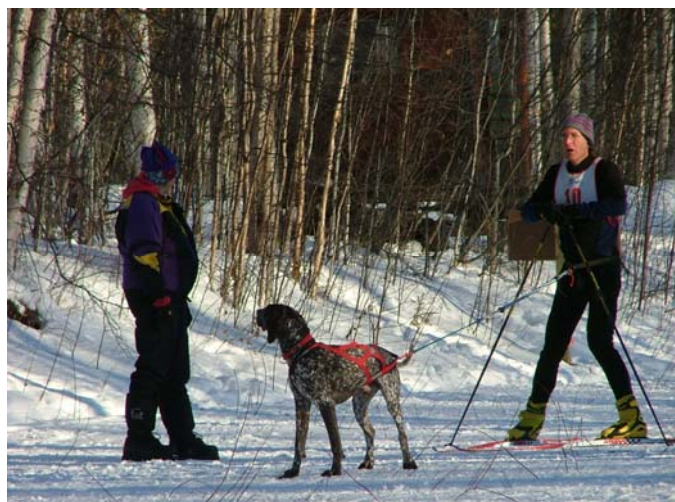
Andy Seitz with Ed and Yeller won the 8 mile class with a new record time of 27:58. Mike Malvick with Corky, Mesa and Ingrid also beat the previous record with a time of 30:00. Matt Bray with Gilbert and Sullivan came in third at 39:17. The challenge of this course was to repeat the same loop a second time. Matt lost valuable time convincing his dogs to continue for the second lap. Andy Seitz held on to win the Distance class with a three day total of 90:58. Mike Malvick came in second with a total of 93:09.

The top three teams all broke the previous 4-mile course record. Cindy Salmon with Coho and Chinook won with a time of 13:46. Andy Warwick with Zip and Licorice placed second at 14:05. Carol Kleckner with Jazz and Chanel were third with 14:24, Peggy Raybeck with Carmen and Bronte were 4th at 14:48, and Emily Bernhardt with Clyde and Wiggy were fifth in the closely packed field at 14:56. Jim Herriges with Ole set a new 4-mile course record with one dog, finishing 6th at 15:29.

Cindy Salmon led all three days in the Short Class, finishing with a total time of 47:11. Carol Kleckner jumped up to second with a total of 50:59. Emily Bernhardt came in third at 51:20.

Fun Race #5 by Carol Kleckner

If you were a spectator at the February 3rd ASPA Fun Race #5 at Creamer's Field you would have wondered if you were watching a skijoring race or some sort of dog ballet and gymnastic competition. Mike Malvick had a nice showing in the back fields as his three dogs Billie, Mons and Victor had a tangle, setting the stage for Chad Carroll to literally fly over Malvick in the most spectacular pass of the day. Actually it wasn't really a pass but more of a vault over the prone Malvick with Carroll remaining upright and catching some air in this feat of balance as his dogs just cleared Malvick's back.

Malvick finished fourth in the 3 dog 3.6 mile competition while Chad finished in the top spot for the 2 dog race for the same distance with Elvis and Tico.

Others in the longer 3 dog class were Andy Warwick with Zip, Licorice, and Boots in first place even though he lost his keys in a nice stopping fall at the start line as he poked the volunteer handler (Karsten Hueffer) with his ski pole. Sara Elzey, with a relatively clean run, was second with Ayla, Chert, and Crowe; and Don Kiely was third with Casper, Daikon, and Chance. Don barely made it to the start line with all of his gear on and a handler running back to retrieve his ski pole that had turned into a javelin.

Behind Carroll in the 2 dog class for the longer distance was Peggy Raybeck (Charlie Brown, Bronte) followed by David French (Boone, Kodi), Janet Smith (Buckwheat, Pete), Sara Tabbert (Pete, Irene), and Dana Truffer-Moudra (Mica, Saphira).

Four teams showed up for the 3.6 mile 1 dog class. Kristan Kelly with Hobbes did the course in a mixed up order but finished first. Kieran Gleason had fun coming in second place even though his dog Rusty Buffalo trotted along beside him today instead of working too much, although RB took out a couple of walkers at the side of the trail when they got between Kieran and the lines. A perfect 10 for the somersaulting pedestrians!

Christy Peterson placed third with Baywolf, a large wheel dog that had never skijored before. Jim Altherr and the ever happy Sophie closed out the class in fourth.

Peggy Raybeck did some nice gymnastics to place first in the 2 dog 2.7 mile race. Her dogs Carmen and Masey managed to run into a dog team on the trail, stringing Peggy between the sled and another skijorer. Peggy executed a beautiful line over the head maneuver to have both all the dogs and herself pointing straight ahead.

Carol Kleckner was second with Misty and Loon. She executed the hard maneuver of skiing to the start line leaving one ski behind. Quick help got her back together for the count down.

Third place went to Don Atwood with Coho, who is 10 months old and still learning the ropes, and Miley, a seasoned pro.

Andy Warwick came back for his second race of the day with Blue and Lady to take first in the 1.4 mile 2 dog class. Lady is also known as Psycho dog for her craziness and constant barking once she is in the car. Laurie Hueffer with Grizzly and Suess were second.

Andy and Susan Seitz came out today with their guitars and singing dogs. Actually Andy and Willie won out over Susan and Waylon and the dogs may have been singing country western but the guitars were left in the car.

In the second old dog race of the year the teams went 0.5 miles. All the dogs were over 10 years old. Carol Kleckner and Beans (11.75 years) won with Janet Smith (Skeeter, 10+) coming in second. Mike Malvick did another wonderful display of ballet artistry and he did a face plant right after the countdown to the admiration of all watching. He and Billie (10.5 years) had won the first older dog race of the season at North Star last week, but Mike went for style today in his well timed fall and tied for third place with Sara Elzey and Myst (11.5 years).

Rounding out the finishers in the Old Dog race were Pat DeRuyter with Crisco (10 years) and Sara Elzey back with Shadow (12.5 years).

The Alder Award 2007

The zen of record keeping makes the skijoring fly! ASPA's annual fifty dollar Alder Award is meant to distinguish the most improved skier/ dog combination during one racing season.. It is an *ad hoc* award that encourages record-keeping and the canine resumé. It will be awarded at the spring barbecue and membership meeting to the most improved skier and dog in ASPA-sponsored events for the 2006-07 season. The winner will be determined by the ASPA Board of Trustees on the basis of the ASPA Dog Resumé submitted by each skier for each dog entered.

Last year the award went to Andy Warwick and his dog Blue, who was rescued through a foster care arrangement with Animal Control from a dog yard where the lot had been tethered for weeks without food or water. Blue, who started out clueless about a harness, doubled his weight and gained new strength in Andy's care, and soon began to improve his skijoring performance recorded in the spring fun races. In the end, Blue became fit enough to join Zip and Licorice, and could keep up with their pace on the shorter distances.

By tallying up times and racing scores, last year's Honorary Mention winner, David French and Boone N. Crockett, JH, his Golden Retriever, found they had improved their over all skijoring performance with about 15% during a multitude of seasonal races counting altogether some 62 miles. Sara Elzey entered a multiple record as she was working with her dogs Shdow, Myst, Ayla and Chert. Her combined records were obviously based on countless training sessions, great stamina and a quick race changing strategy showing a constant improvement even with dogs beyond the ordinary retirement age..

This is the second season for the Alder award initiated by Chuck and Tone Deehr. in honor of Aspenlair's Alder, an 80 lb AKC Siberian Husky, who has patiently given his strength and endurance to ASPA events for a number of years. Like so many of the dogs we often take for granted, he is quiet in the starting gate, has broken two Apocalypse skijor harnesses on the word "GO", encourages other dogs while on the trail, and squabbles with no one.

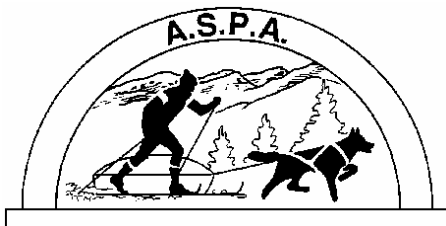
