Andy contributed a huge amount of time and effort to ASPA events. In addition to serving on the board, Andy coordinated the Fun Races, including many fun race duties, which often left him unable to race when other volunteers were not available. He helped time and coordinated prizes for almost all ASPA events. For the first leg of the Race Across the Valley (RAV) at Chena Lakes, volunteers were scarce, so Andy first timed his own team and then served as starter, handler, and timer for the rest of the entrants. In addition he helped out with the remaining two legs of RAV. In addition to the races, Andy has helped groom the ASPA trails, helped find a new groomer for us to test out, and helped set a course for the Birch Hill Race.

Jim Herriges was successful in obtaining the new ASPA club snowmachine. He worked hard to figure and fill out all of the grant paperwork. Afterwards, Jim had to deal with even more paperwork after the new snow machine was obtained (registration, insurance coverage, etc.). He also helped train the volunteer groomers on how to operate the new machine and how to perform the necessary maintenance. Also, for the past several years, Jim has coordinated the Birch Hill race. This entailed working with FNSB Parks & Recreation and the Nordic Ski Club to gain permission for the event and get the trails groomed before and after the race. He also coordinated volunteers to set up the race course and take it down before and after the race and worked with Race Director, Pat DeRuyter, to coordinate start times, prizes, publicity, volunteers, etc.

So again, we congratulate and thank our 2006/2007 volunteers of the Year. In addition to Andy and Jim, other volunteer of the year nominees were Carol Kleckner, Pat DeRuyter, and Lisa Stuby, and Peggy Raybeck.

The next morning, I was running a little late, so I got into the car, put a canine seat belt harness on my dog Killae and then strapped myself into my own seat belt. Killae, like a lot of Fairbanks canines, likes to ride shotgun. A few years ago my mother visited from California and commented that she never saw anything like it, all of the Fairbanks dogs riding shotgun. It has only been in the past couple of months that I purchased a canine seat belt harness and started strapping him in. Well, as I went around the corner near Goldstream Creek, with my mind on work, being late, a trip I had to take to Juneau, etc. I hit ice from the freezing rain the night before, spun completely out of control, and my car went off the bank and rolled about 260 degrees. All I can remember was a white blur and Killae squealing loudly. Thanks to our seatbelts, we both walked away, shaken, but unhurt. Had Killae not had a seat belt on, he would have surely been seriously injured or killed.

It is important when our canine friends share the road with us, that they too are secured by seatbelts, pet porters, etc. I hadn't had any more than a minor fender-bender in the past 24 years, so March 7th was a real eye opener. Now when I drive, I am much more cautious and am thinking of the weather and road conditions, as well as my speed around corners. At first Killae didn't like his seatbelt and now he is used to it and doesn't seem to mind wearing it.

She was the 4th sled dog to join the Kleckner household. She is what mushers call a "wheezer." She has laryngeal paralysis, a hereditary disorder which effects her ability to breath properly. Most dogs with this disorder die within their first year of life. As a puppy she was very symptomatic with her wheezing. She was harness broke at 6 months of age but she worked so hard that her tongue would turn blue and Carol would have to take her out of the team to run alongside. She had to be watched at all times during a run. As she grew older she learned how to regulate herself and soon she became a fabulous lead dog (although she never really seemed to understand gee and ha....). She has always been a total house-dog and has rarely been chained up. Her drive and enthusiasm continues to this day even though she will soon turn 11 years old! Carol was warned that Chanel probably wouldn't live to see her first birthday, but something made her plead for her life, and luckily her owners agreed to give her to Carol.

Chanel's favorite pastime is watching anything on PBS. Her favorite shows are Sesame Street and Telly Tubbies. She will sit for an hour at the bottom of the bed and watch in rapt attention.

Carol says "Chanel's presence in my life has made me appreciate and admire the drive and happiness that a dog can have even when handicapped. Chanel doesn't know that she is different. She just gives life 100% of her whole being. She deserves to be recognized."

ASPA Skijor Orienteering, March 16, 2008, Creamer's Field as reported by Pat DeRuyter

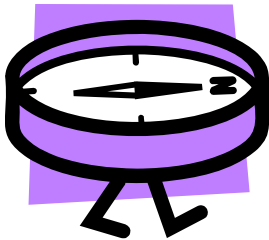
Six skijorers and 7 runners/walkers participated in the sixth Annual ASPA Orienteering Event held following the Open North American on Sunday at Creamer's Field. Participants used a map with clues to find 20 "controls" around the Creamer's Fields, the Boreal Forest Trail, and the ADMA maintained trails on the Creamer's Waterfowl Refuge. The Skijorers had to cover 11 miles of trail to collect all 20 "controls" while the runners/walkers needed to cover about 6 miles to collect all the "controls".

2004 champion Matt Bray outscored defending champion Chad Carroll in the 60 minute skijoring class. Matt with Gilbert and Sullivan scored the maximum of 1000 points in 59 minutes to edge out Chad Carroll with Tico and Elvis who scored 950 points in 60 minutes. Third place went to Peggy Raybeck with Charlie Brown who collected 800 points but was assessed a 100 point penalty for returning 10 minutes late. The dogs with famous names seem to excel in this event.

In the running/walking class last years champion, Maria Bray with Natasha successfully defended her title with a total of 800 points. Maria brought back 930 points but was assessed a 130 point penalty for returning 13 minutes late. Dan Borton with Allie was a close second with 780 points with no penalties. Hal Meyer and Jimmiedog finished third with 590 points.

Sara Elzey with her 14 year old retired skijor dog, Shadow won the 30 minute running/walking class with a total of 580 points.

Fun Race #7 and Year End BBQ, March 29, 2008 North Star Golf Course as reported by Pat DeRuyter

The Alaska Skijoring and Pulk Association held its last Fun Race of the Season at North Star Golf Club on Saturday, March 29, 2008. The near perfect trail conditions and weather led to five new season records and well as a record field of 38 participants.

The largest field of the day was the 4mile 1-dog class. Bruce Miller and Roy led the field of 10 teams with a winning time of 15:18. Wallace Bandeff (Finny) was second at 17:01 followed by Adam Verrier with a borrowed dog, Chico at 17:03. Christy Gleason (Kogosay) at 19:51 and Ted Wu (Ty) at 19:50 rounded out the top five teams.

Peggy Raybeck with Masey and Carmen won the 4mile 2-dog class with a time of 14:40. Amanda Byrd with Rupert and Jolene were second at 15:11 followed by Laurie Hueffer (Addie and Pence) at 15:47.

Jessie Warwick (Zip, Boots and Licorice) was only 2 seconds off his own season record for the 4 mile 3-dog class with a winning time of 13:51. Sara Elzey (Ayla, Millie, Robin) was second only 8 seconds back. Carol Kleckner (Jazz, BB, Jenny) were third in the closely packed field with a time of 14:13.

In the 6 mile 1-dog class Jim Herriges with Lena set a new season record with a winning time of 21:27. Sara Tabbert with Rothko was second at 30:01 and Nina Ruckhaus (Tracker) was third at 31:50.

John Schauer (Willow, Riley and Tsaina) won the 6mile 3-dog class with a time of 24:38. Don Kiely with Daikon, Chance, and Casper were a close second at 24:53.

Two records fell in the 2mile class. Don Kiely (Izzi, Raja, Loon) set a new record in the 3-dog class with a winning time of 8:14. Sara Elzey with Chert, Crowe, and Misty were second at 8:40.

In the 2-dog class, Carol Kleckner with Chanel and Shaman set a new record with a time of 7:02. Chanel capped her winning season by also taking home the ASPA Alder Award given to the most improved/exceptional dog for her accomplishments during the 2007-2008 skijor season. Congratulations Chanel!! Peggy Raybeck with Charlie and Tracker were second with a time of 7:46. Third went to Janna Miller (Roy and Lilly) with a time of 8:50.

Jim Herriges won his second race of the day. This was the 2mile 1-dog class with Ole in a time of 8:34. Laurie Hueffer with Suess were second at 12:39.

The closest race of the day was the .75 mile old or beginner dog class. Just 6 seconds separated the top three teams. Lisa Baraff with Scooter won at 4:10. Sara Elzey with Shadow was second at 4:11 and Christy Gleason with Milkyway was third at 4:16.

In the 8mile classes, Kieran Gleason with Rustybuffalo, Kenzie, and Husquarna set a new record at 33:49 in the 3-dog class. Chad Carroll with Tico and Elvis won the two dog class in 33:01.

In the final relay, the team of Carol Kleckner, Don Kiely and Sara Elzey won with a time of 7:33. Second place went to the team of Nina Ruckhaus, Gail Davidson and Wallace Bandeff with a time of 7:46. Third place went to the team of Chad Carroll, Laurie Hueffer and Ted Wu with a time of 7:54.

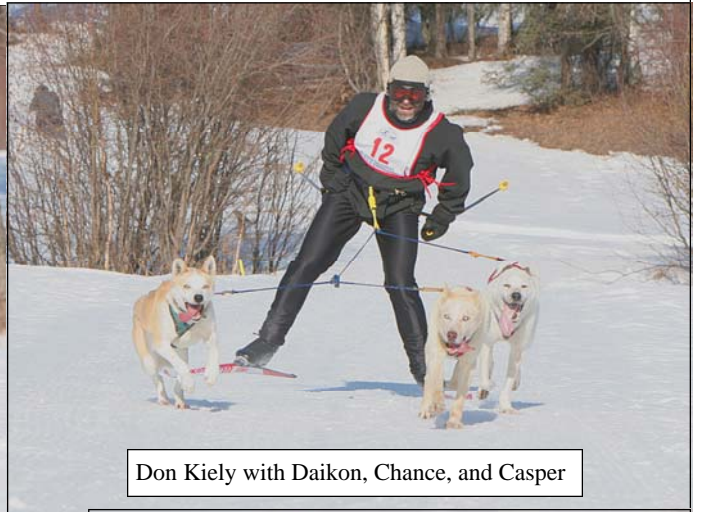

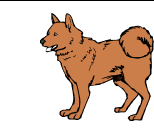

Birch Hill Skijor Race 2008 by Jim Herriges

Twenty seven skijorers and at least twice as many dogs took advantage of perfect weather and trails at Birch Hill. Temperatures of 10° F at the start were received favorably by the dogs; some had raced in the Limited North American Championships the previous weekend at 42° F.

The largest race class was the one-dog 9K mass start race. Jim Herriges and Lena pulled away from the pack early and managed to stay away, finishing in 19 minutes 27 seconds. Mike Kramer and Labrador retriever Decoy were behind the front of the pack early, but with strong skiing Kramer was able to move to the front of the pack and eventually open a gap and pull away. Kramer finished in 20:47, followed by Susan Seitz and Yeller in 21:14 and Andy Seitz and Willie in 21:45. Bruce Miller and Australian shepherd Roy finished in 23:19, rounding out the top five. The competitive field also produced fast times—the winning time took about four minutes off the times of the 2006 and 2007 9K events.

In the 13K two-dog mass start race, Brian Charlton with Bonnie and Clyde pulled gradually away from Matt Bray (with Rainy and Sullivan) and Emily Bernhardt (with Coral and Wiggy). Charlton finished in 26 minutes 54 seconds followed by Bray in 29:12 and Bernhardt close behind in 29:20.

The one-dog event was also the most popular of the shorter Fun classes. Virginia Parrish and Homer won the 4K one-dog event in a time of 10 minutes and 10 seconds, followed by Sarah Thornton and Raven in 11:11, and Rebecca Gilbert and Sharlee in 13:20.

Peggy Raybeck with Masey and Carmen topped the two-dog 6K event in 13:56.

Jesse Warwick (with Zip, Licorice, and Boots) led the three-dog 6K class in 12 minutes and 30 seconds, followed by Sara Elzey (Ayla, Millie, and Jazz).

The 3 X 3K relay was won by the *Typhoid Mary* team (A. Seitz, S. Seitz, Herriges). *Dog Power* (Charlton, Bernhardt, Elzey) was second and *The Last Edition* (Raybeck, Gilbert, Parrish) third. Andy Seitz set the pace on the starting leg and finished with the fastest overall time of 6 minutes, 44 seconds, but was followed closely to the finish by Dan Carlson (*Delinquents*) and Brian Charlton (*Dog Power*). Seitz' *Typhoid Mary* team members didn't match his pace, but stayed ahead of the other competitors to win.

Thanks to the Fairbanks North Star Borough for use of facilities and trails and the Nordic Ski Club of Fairbanks groomers Tom Helmers and Andy Blossy for impeccably groomed trails. Andy Warwick and Jim Herriges marked the trails and were aided by Brian and Emma Charlton, Sara Elzey and Peggy Raybeck in the post-race cleanup. Jim Herriges organized the event, Pat DeRuyter registered racers and directed the race day events. Andy Warwick also conducted timing and organized race prizes.
